### AGGRAVATED BATTERY

On 05-09-23 at 2213 hrs, Police responded to McDonalds, 352 S Division St, regarding a disturbance. It was further reported three subjects fled the scene in a vehicle. Upon arrival officers located a Harvard Resident (m-18) with facial injuries. The resident was subsequently transported by the Harvard Fire Protection District to Mercy Harvard Hospital for treatment and later released. A short time later a Harvard Youth (m-16 yoa), was arrested and charged with one count of Aggravated Battery, and one count of Mob Action. The Youth was petitioned to McHenry County Court Services and transported to the Kane County Juvenile Detention Center. The case remains under investigation.
