22-002907 CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

On 07-13-22 at 0644 hrs, police responded to the City of Harvard Aquatic Center, 607 Galvin Parkway for a Criminal Damage to Property Report. Upon arrival Officers discovered an unknown person(s) had broken out the front glass doors, and a side office window.

During the preliminary investigation at approximately 0120 hrs it was discovered two unknown subjects walked up to the building carrying what appears to be baseball bats. The subjects then strike the front doors and side office window breaking them. The subjects are then seen fleeing from the scene on foot heading westbound.

UPDATE

After a thorough and intensive investigation by members of the Harvard Police Department Investigations Unit the two subjects involved in damaging the Harvard Aquatic Center on July 13, 2022 were identified and charges were subsequently approved by the McHenry County State's Attorney Office.

On Wednesday, August 17, 2022 at approximately 1610 hrs, a Marengo Youth (m-17 yoa), was arrested and charged with One Count of Criminal Damage to Property over \$300.00 but less than \$10,000.00 and One Count Criminal Damage to Government Supported Property more than \$500.00 but less than \$10,000.00. The Marengo Youth was petitioned to McHenry County Court Services and released to a parent.

On Friday, August 19, 2022 at approximately 1059 hrs, Nayeli Ariel Govea (f-18 yoa), 20808 Lembke Rd, Harvard was arrested on a McHenry County Warrant for One Count of Criminal Damage to Property over \$300.00 but less than \$10,000.00 and One Count Criminal Damage to Government Supported Property more than \$500.00 but less than \$10,000.00. Govea was unable to post the \$20,000.00/10% applies bond and was transported to the McHenry County Jail.

The public is reminded individuals arrested or charged is not evidence of guilt and that all defendants in a criminal case are presumed innocent until proven guilty is a court of law.
