#### ATTEMPT FLEEING OR ATTEMPTING TO ELUDE A POLICE OFFICER

On 09-13-22 at 2244 hrs, a Woodstock Youth (f-17 yoa), was arrested for Attempt Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Police Officer after officers attempted to stop the her for Disobeying a Traffic Control Device while driving a 2003 Ford at the intersection of N Division St and N Ayer St. The vehicle failed stop for officers and continued driving for several miles before stopping in the 19500 blk of Rt 173. The Youth was issued a citation for Disobeying a Traffic Control Device, Unlicensed, Not Driving on the Right Side of the Roadway, Attempt Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Operating an Uninsured Vehicle, Reckless Driving, and Speeding 35+ over Posted Speed Limit. The Youth was also issued a Non-Traffic Notice to Appear Citation for Unlawful Possession of Alcohol by a Person under 21 years of age under City of Harvard ordinance. The youth was released to a guardian with a court date of 10-19-22 at 1330 hrs.

The public is reminded individuals arrested or charged is not evidence of guilt and that all defendants in a criminal case are presumed innocent until proven guilty is a court of law.
